



New Postcards For Circuit Breaker Disabled Riders

The State of Illinois will be mailing out new postcards for disabled persons who qualify for the Illinois Circuit Breaker Program. Persons who applied after January 1, 2009 will automatically receive the new postcard in the mail. The new card is white with blue text. If you applied before this date you will need to reapply to the Circuit Breaker program in order to get the new postcard.

The postcards can be used as identification for free rides on B-NPTS fixed route buses. The new card will go into effect July 1, 2009. The current yellow postcard will not be valid after June 30, 2009. Through June 30, 2009, B-NPTS will accept both postcard versions for free rides on the fixed route buses. Just show the postcard to the driver.

If you already have a B-NPTS issued Elderly/Disabled Free Ride ID card you need not take any further action. Just continue to use your B-NPTS Free Ride ID when boarding the bus.
